94% of homeowners felt their lives had improved since

- 90% saw an improvement in their family's health since becoming a Habitat homeowner.
- 65% of Habitat Homeowners felt they were somewhat or much better at saving money since moving into their home.
- 85% of the donations to Habitat are used for Homeownership Opportunities
- \$3.3 million were invested in new construction in 2020 for Habitat homes.

As I sit to write a few thoughts at this time I think about how will we be planning for each Sunday. Jacob and I have been working together to pick hymns by gathering ourselves via zoom at least once a month to pick hymns which fit the scripture of the service. This past week I was advised by an individual that we hadn't picked any familiar hymns for this past Sunday. Since I knew that was true......I thought maybe I should share a part of our process.

First, we read the scripture which has been selected provided to us by Sione. We generally can key into the theme of the biblical story. Second, we look in the hymn index, google information, and attempt to cross reference text, meaning, and focus predictions. Third, we always read thru the text of the hymn, usually sing thru the melodic line, and discuss if we think it would "fit". Many times a specific hymn will immediately come to mind. Unfortunately, that doesn't always happen. Jacob always asks if the congregation knows a hymn and I will admit sometimes we have selected things because we think the text is very good. (The week before last that was especially true--and we ignored that question of if the congregation knew the hymn.--I guess I was bad for that week. But we all need to expand our learning base.)

We are always willing to accept your suggestions for hymns and I know I miss the fifth Sunday singing selections we have usually done. Since the advent season has passed us now, the hymn selections will be a bit harder. Christmas time is always a joy to select the traditional carols, hymns which totally follow the Biblical calendar of Christ's arrival. During the Month of December we attempted to select a combination of traditional music, as well excellent text components. Your hymnal is a great resource to utilize for your personal devotions, Bible study, group discussions, and reflections.

I am hopeful you have been reading the "tidbits" about the music selections in the bulletin/email which is sent out. It has been intended to give you a bit of history on the selection and why it was chosen.

It has been my distinct pleasure to work with Jacob, Gabriel, Kevin, Carlos, and our dedicated tech team, and all who assist in worship. We continue to be God's work in progress and I thank you for being with us on Sunday's for worship.

From Trustees

In January The Board of Trustees had their first meeting for 2021. Some of the projects they will continue working on as the year begins are:

- Roof repair on the flat surface above the West Narthex.
- Work with the church's security company to upgrade the security system.
- Complete the outside entrance and security lights around the building,
- Replace the lighting inside the message board on the South/East corner of the building with upgraded LED lighting.
- Repair and upgrade the counter in the women's restroom on Fellowship Hall level.
- Clean or replace cover on rose window on West side of building.
- Polishing or oiling pews in the sanctuary and furniture in the Parlor.

Members of the board will be doing a walk-through of the building to address safety concerns and maintenance issues.



Check Writing Steps

(Excerpts from Huntington Bank)

This is a refresher course on writing checks to the church. We have received checks with missing dates; missing Payees; missing numerical amounts; unreadable written amounts; missing signatures, etc.

From experience, we sometimes know the intention, but the bank does not. When writing a check for a donation and a purchase, it helps us if you write separate checks because donations and purchases are processed differently. Thank you.

Step 1: Date the check. Write the date on the line provided. This step is important, so the bank and the

church know when you wrote it.

Step 2: "Pay to the order of". Write the name of the church. You can either write 'First United Methodist Church' or just put 'FUMC'.

Step 3: Write the payment amount in numbers. There are two spots on a check where you write the amount you are paying. First, write the dollar amount numerically (for example \$130.45) in the small box on the right. Any corrections or changes are questionable – especially to the bank.

Step 4: Write the payment amount in words. On the line below "Pay to the order of," write out the dollar amount in words to match the numerical dollar amount you wrote in the box. For example, if you are paying \$130.45, you write "one hundred thirty and 45/100." If the dollar amount is a round number, still include "and 00/100" for additional clarity. Writing the dollar amount in words is important. Again, any corrections or changes are questionable – especially to the bank.

Step 5: Write a memo. Filling out the line that says "Memo" is optional, but very important this time of the year. **If you want your donation to go towards a designated cause, please write it on the memo line.** If it is left blank, it usually goes to your account as 'General Fund' or 'Pledge'.

Step 6: Sign the check. Sign your name on the line at the bottom right-hand corner.

Reference #5. To ensure that your donation goes where you want it to, please either 1) write it on the Memo Line of your check or 2) include a note with giving information. If not specified, your donation will be credited to the general / pledge fund.

Protect Yourself from Social Security Scans (From the Social Security Administration Website)

Be on the lookout for fake calls, texts, and emails

Scammers are pretending to be government employees. They may threaten you and may demand immediate payment to avoid arrest or other legal action. Do not be fooled!

Be Alert

Social Security may call you in some situations but will **never**:

- Threaten you.
- Suspend your Social Security number.
- Demand an immediate payment from you.
- Require payment by cash, gift card, pre-paid debit card, or wire transfer.
- Ask for gift card numbers over the phone or to wire or mail cash.

Social Security may email or text you about programs and services, but will never ask for a return call to an unknown number. Social Security only sends emails or text messages if you have opted in to receive them and only in limited situations, including the following:

- When you have subscribed with Social Security to receive updates and notifications by text or email.
- As part of Social Security's enhanced security when accessing your personal my Social Security
 account.

What to look for

- The caller or sender says there is a **problem** with your Social Security number or account.
- Any call, text, or email asking you to pay a fine or debt with retail gift cards, wire transfers, pre-paid debit cards, internet currency, or by mailing cash.
- Scammers **pretend** they are from Social Security or another government agency. Caller ID, texts, or documents sent by email may look official but **they are not**.
- Callers threaten you with arrest or other legal action.

Be Active

Protect yourself, friends, and family!

- If you receive a questionable call, hang up and report it at oig.ssa.gov.
- Do not return unknown calls, emails, or texts.
- Ask someone you trust for advice before making any large purchase or financial decision.
- Do not be embarrassed to report if you shared personal information or suffered a financial loss.
