Brothers and Sisters in the Family of Faith,

Grace and Peace to you in the name of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior.

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday, (this year on February 26th), and ends on Holy Saturday, April 11th. The word Lent is derived from the Anglo-Saxon, word *lencten*, which means spring. It is a preparation for celebrating Easter. Historically, Lent began as a period of fasting and preparation for baptism by converts and then became a time of penance by all Christians. The first Sunday describes Jesus' temptation by Satan; and the sixth Sunday, (Passion/Palm Sunday) Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem.

So, the Lenten season is a time when all Christians turn with Jesus to face the cross. It is a time of reflection, of receiving and giving and of losing and finding. It is a time when we are forced to face the truth about our walk with Christ and re-evaluate our sense of direction and to compare our focus and desires to Christ.

When Jesus turned his face toward Jerusalem, he knew the road would end at Golgatha, yet he neither turned away nor slowed his step. Every Lenten season we are asked to travel that road with Jesus, so we can better understand his life and death. The path we follow with him might be called the Via Dolorosa, or "The way of sorrows." Some say the path began in Bethlehem, others contend it began with his baptism. I agree with Max Lucado, who wrote the Via Dolorosa began in the hall of Heaven. The journey began when God left Heavens gates in search of us. God was armed with nothing more than a passion to win your heart. God came looking for you with only one thought in mind. God wanted to bring his children home.

This year we will begin the journey on Ash Wednesday, February 26th, with services being held at 12:00 noon and 7:00 pm.

Worship services will follow the Via Dolorosa beginning on March 1st, the first Sunday of Lent and will continue into April until Palm Sunday, using the following Scriptures:

Have you signed up for the King Sooper Rewards program?

If you haven't already signed-up to link the church with your Loyalty Card, please consider doing so. It's easy! Just follow the following steps:

The community rewards program for King Soopers has changed. Once your current reloadable card is empty it can no longer be used. The rewards program is now linked to your **Loyalty Card**. This is the same card you use when checking out to get discounts and fuel points.

Here are the steps you need to follow to link the church with your Loyalty Card:

1. You will need to have an online account with King Soopers. Go to kingsoopers.com and follow the steps to create a new account. You will need your Loyalty Card to do this.
2. Once you are logged into your account go to the left side of your screen. You will see several options regarding your account. The 6th option down should say "Community Rewards." Click on this.
3. In the middle of the screen you should see "Find an Organization." Type in **BY112**. This will take you directly to the church link. Make sure it says First United Methodist Church, 917 10th Ave, Greeley.
4. Click enroll.
5. After clicking enroll you will see "Donation Summary" Status Currently Enrolled.
6. You are done! Now use your Loyalty Card every time you check out and the church receives a donation.

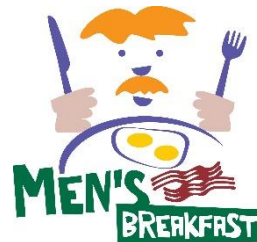

“Cost of Home” Lenten Fundraising Calendar

You will find a calendar insert which covers the period of Lent: the 40 (forty) days between Ash Wednesday (February 26) and Easter (April 12), excluding Sundays. The object of this calendar is to help us appreciate our own homes and raise money for Greeley-Weld Habitat for Humanity. Each day on the calendar lists something about our home that we can appreciate. Day 20 says, “For each garage door opener, deposit 75¢” Especially in winter, do we appreciate the convenience of pushing a button to open or close the garage door? What about Day 21? “Add \$1 if you have a washing machine.” Let’s give thanks for the ease of doing laundry in our own home; no lugging dirty clothes to the laundromat.



Along with the daily suggestion of a donation for a feature of our house, is a scripture. For example, Day 32: “For each tree in your yard, deposit 25¢.” The scripture, Genesis 2:9 says, “And the Lord God made all kinds of trees grow out of the ground – trees that were pleasing to the eye and good for food.” Use the Habitat Calendar as part of your daily devotions.

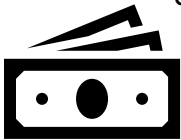
On Sundays, the calendar gives a fact about the housing situation in Greeley-Weld County. For example, the 2nd Sunday of Lent informs us, “The average rent in Greeley has more than doubled in the past six years.” Home ownership for a family also improves the lives of the children. The 5th Sunday of Lent tells us, “Children of homeowners are 116% more likely to graduate college.”

The “Cost of Home” Fundraising Calendar is designed to encourage us to contemplate the people and things that make a home, as well as exploring what those living in dilapidated, overcrowded, or insecure housing may experience just to get through every day. All the physical characteristics mentioned on the calendar make a house, but the family makes a home.



Habitat for Humanity creates a pathway out of poverty through affordable homeownership. There are three selection criteria: 1) need for safe decent housing, 2) ability to repay mortgage, 3) willingness to partner.

Our hope is that you will develop a new appreciation for your own home through this Lenten calendar. You can put the money in a container every day. (Probably not the small paper house handed out in church!) Or, you can just mark the amount on the calendar and write a check for the total to First United Methodist Church and note “Habitat” on the memo line. Please return your contributions to the church the Sunday after Easter, April 19, 2020. The money will go to the 2020 Faith Build home.
