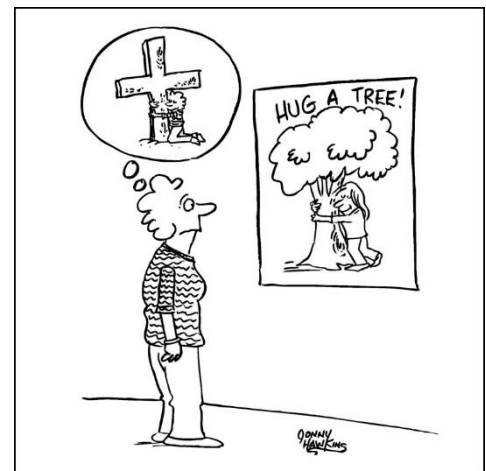
You are beautiful
