Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This week I discovered an enjoyable TV show called *Ted Lasso*. It is about a coach that went from coaching a division two college football program, in Wichita Kansas, to coaching a premier soccer team in England. The coach knows nothing about soccer, but his coaching style, his positive attitude, and his clever strategy unites an awful team and makes them a contender. What I really love about the show is coach Lasso's optimism and funny lines. In one episode, several team members and coaching staff were talking about the facilities being haunted. The coach was asked if he believed in ghosts. Coach Lasso responded, "I suppose I do. But, more importantly, I hope they believe in themselves."

I thought that was a great answer. I also think that is how I would answer if someone wanted to know if I believe in the church. I do believe in the church, but more importantly I hope you all believe in yourselves. Many people might give plenty of reasons our confidence should be shaken. It is true that church attendance across the board has been dropping for decades. The average age of church attenders continues to get higher. God calls us God's own children. God sees us as the body of Christ. We also get to carry out the greatest message into a broken and hurting world. Our success is not measured by the number of people in the pews, a growing church budget, or by the size and beauty of our church buildings. Our success is measured in lives touched by acts of love and grace. We are still successfully carrying out our call with every act of grace. God is not finished with us yet! God has not exited the world! This is what you can believe in: God is still present, God is still making a way, God is still healing. God is transforming this world by blessing and using every act of kindness, every word of love shared, and every thought of mercy given.

It is this act of God sanctifying our actions, words, and thoughts that gives us power. It is because of God living in and through us that this world is being renewed and transformed day by day. It is because of God's grace that we cannot fail. We are called to love this world in whatever hurting form it presents itself to us. We can only love because God first loved us. It is easy to get discouraged. It is easy to think we can't do anything. Have faith. Believe you are a difference maker, believe the church has a message worth hearing, believe the body of Christ is actively healing the world. For God is the source behind it all.

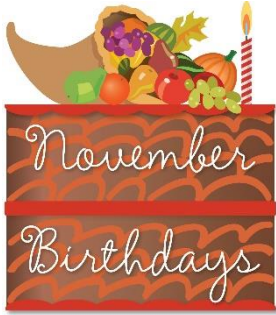

This event is sponsored by the City of Greeley, the Philharmonic Guild, and business partners. Our bell ringers begin working on music for this event in mid-October. They generally present some of their music during worship time in December, but you will only get to hear all of their 20-to-30-minute concert at the actual Festival of Trees Presentation. On **Sunday November 7th**, we will be honoring those who have gone before us this past year. If you would like to have a loved one honored, who is not a church member, please let the office know and we will add their name to the list to be read during the worship service.



Confirmation is an important milestone in the life of a disciple of Jesus. It is an opportunity to affirm the vows made at baptism and, for some, to make their own declaration of faith as they are baptized and confirmed at the same time. It has been our practice to offer confirmation class to youth grades 6 and up. Throughout our ministry, we have developed our own curriculum using trusted United Methodist resources. This curriculum involves five two-hour sessions and one weekend retreat in Denver to participate in worship with other faith traditions, Christian denominations, and a couple different expressions of United Methodist worship. One of those is Denver After Hours, whose congregation serves lunches to the homeless in Civic Center Park 365 days a year. Past youth who have participated report that the worship retreat has had the biggest impact on our confirmands. We encourage families to work schedules around this important weekend.

An important part of confirmation is developing a relationship with a mentor who will accompany your child through the year. It is best if you and your child choose someone with whom your child will feel comfortable and who will be committed to this relationship. It might be a grandparent, a neighbor, or someone from within the church. We ask that each mentor/child pair meet monthly between November and March. We will have guided worksheets for the two to work through together and will send them home with the kids following our first session. It's important to let mentors know that they are not expected to do any teaching, just reflecting on their faith with your child. If you are having trouble thinking of someone to ask, please let us know. There are several members of the church who would love to be your child's mentor and we can pair them up as needed.

This year, we are pleased to partner with Ft. Morgan and Brush UMCs for confirmation! A tentative schedule for the year is as follows (all Sunday sessions are from 2:00-4:00 p.m.):

November 7th: Trinity and the Creeds (Greeley UMC)

December 5th: Church History (Ft. Morgan UMC)

January 9th: Bible (Greeley UMC)

February 11-13: Worship Retreat and Wesleyan Theology

March 6th: Church Polity (Ft. Morgan UMC)

March 16st: Meet with the Church's Administrative Council (7:00 p.m.)

April 17th: Easter Sunday! Confirmation Day!

Thank you for trusting us with this important step in your child's faith journey! It is a big task, to be sure, but we trust it will be meaningful and fun for the kids, too. Please let us know through email, text, or phone call if your child will be participating so that we know who to plan for. Looking forward to hearing from you all!
