This year's Community Volunteer of the Year award from Greeley-Weld Habitat for Humanity will be presented to the Sewing for Service group of First United Methodist Church for their quilt donations. Every child receives a

warm, colorful comforter/quilt from Sewing for Service at the dedication of their forever home. There has been a Greeley-Weld Habitat for Humanity affiliate for 35 years and nearly 200 homes have been constructed during that time. That equals a lot of quilts!!

The award will be given at the Annual Breakfast on <u>Thursday, July 20, 2023</u>, at Christ Community Church, 1301 15th Street from 6:45 to 8:15 a.m. It would be <u>wonderful</u> to have a lot of FUMC members at the breakfast to help celebrate. Every year, Greeley-Weld Habitat for Humanity hosts its signature fundraising breakfast in July with Dick Monfort, CEO and owner of the Colorado Rockies as the featured speaker. Dick Monfort will match donations up to \$100,000, automatically doubling your donation. In the last six years, the annual breakfast has helped raise \$1,000,000.00, providing a dream come true and building equity for many local families in need of an opportunity to become homeowners.

Local and Global

The Local and Global Commission would like to thank everyone who contributed to our successful April Food Drive. Our congregation contributed \$670 and 145 pounds of food. Peanut butter was approximately 45 of the total 145 pounds. Our second food drive of the year will be in October.

This Food Drive shows how compassionate and giving our congregation is!!

The Local and Global Commission would like to thank the congregation for their generous Easter offering. We have fulfilled the pledges we made to nonprofits for 2023 and have additional funds. The group discussed what we should do. 2023 has been a frustrating year for everyone as the cost of everything has increased, especially heat bills. The heating bills for the church were \$3,754.57 in January, \$3,060.08 in February and \$2,900.11 for March. The Trustees have done everything they can to reduce costs wherever possible. These high bills have led to a deficit in our operating budget for the church. After discussion, Local and Global decided to help care for our church home and contribute \$2,000 to the deficit in the operating account. We would like to encourage everyone to contribute a little extra if possible.

SPRC

Just who is the Staff Parish Relations Committee and what do they do?

Our task is in our name "Build Relationships". We are kind of like the Human Relations (HR) of the church. In every congregation the SPRC must focus on building strong relationships between the staff and the congregation and between the congregation and the District Superintendent (DS). Building relationships and handling administrative tasks can be challenging so the committee is crucial to a vital and effective congregation.

We have directed suggestions for managing our responsibilities, with assigned tasks for each quarter of the calendar year. The United Methodist Church gives the SPRC the responsibility for administering the relationship between the Staff, Congregation, and the DS so that the church can keep moving forward.

These past 5 months we have been completing staff, Pastor and our SPR committee annual evaluations. We have written new evaluation policy guidelines which are more Objective and less Subjective for our employees. This is just part of what we are working on. One of our goals is to get through the employee handbook by the end of the year, updating items that have changed or need to change as our church has changed. We are reviewing, writing as

needed, all of the job descriptions that are in the appendices of the handbook. Interviewing and hiring is a continual process at times, and we have been working with Daniel and Travis these past 5 months and will continue to work with them as Travis returns from sabbatical and Daniel moves on to greater paths ahead for him after graduation.

To do our tasks well, we need and encourage the support and input from all of our congregation members. Evaluations need to come from all areas of the church and not just a select few. We want to hear from all of you when things are going well and when things may not seem to be going as well as you might think they should be going.

We meet regularly, as stated earlier, in closed session at least once a quarter and any or many other times as needed. Our administrative function of the SPRC includes *Leadership* and *Management, keeping an eye on the big picture and daily activities.* We are a diverse group of 7, which were elected and appointed to the committee at this time, including as required, a lay-member of the annual conference and a lay-leader of the church. We hope to bring you more in the quarters to come of our duties and actions that have taken place. Thank you for taking time to read this and we look forward to hear more from all of you.


