Pastor's Letter,

I love chicken noodle soup. I must admit that I am a traditionalist when it comes to my chicken noodle soup. Just the basics are all I need: chicken, chicken broth, egg noodles, celery, carrots, and maybe a little salt and pepper. I might even enjoy a little garlic in my soup on the days I am feeling kind of wild. What can I say? I like the delicious simplicity of traditional chicken soup. Lately, when I've been served chicken soup, I have discovered that other people are trying new things to doctor it up.

The first changes I noticed were in the noodles. I have seen egg noodles replaced by angel hair spaghetti. I even have seen people use ramen noodles in place of my beloved, fat, fluffy egg noodles. The most notable noodle replacement I have seen is using barley in place of the pasta. After they messed with my noodles, they came after the veggies. ## Sewing for Service Quilt Sale - November 19th



Lots of <u>great things</u> will be happening at church on **Sunday. November 19<sup>th</sup>**. Of course, there will be good things to eat because it's the Annual Thanksgiving Feast. There will also be beautiful quilts/comforters to admire and purchase.

During 2023 Sewing for Service has already donated 81 quilts to veterans, children in new Habitat homes, the Department of Human Services and the Greeley Family House. Don't worry! We saved the most beautiful ones for you!! Cold winter weather is coming; maybe you or someone you know needs a warm blanket. Most of the quilts will be twin size, but we also have several colorful quilts for children and flannel baby blankets for wee ones. Gerry Bertelsen's family donated one of her large hand quilted quilts. It will be priced at \$600, but the prices for the tied comforters that we make range from \$10 for a baby quilt to \$100 for a full-size one. Bargains galore!!

We have received several donations of completed quilts, fabric and batting this year, so we have even more colorful and creative designs. The proceeds from the sale pay for batting, thread and repairs to keep the sewing machines humming. If you won't be in church on November 19<sup>th</sup>, you can also shop for a quilt any Wednesday afternoon and watch us at work.

Sewing for Service meets Wednesday afternoons in Fellowship Hall from 1 to 3 p.m. We can always use an extra pair of hands to help tie knots. Some of our members work at home, pinning the fabric so it is ready to be stitched or tying knots while watching TV. Would you like to help with that? Or, there are zillions of squares that have been cut and are waiting for someone to arrange them in attractive patterns and designs. Also, yards of fabric that can be made into a design of your choice. Are you just waiting to release your artistic talents? Join our group! There is always some way you can help this important outreach to our community.
