SPRC Just who is the <u>Staff Parish Relations Committee</u> and what do we do?

In every congregation the SPRC must focus on building strong relationships between the staff and the congregation. Finding a balance between building relationships and handling administrative tasks can be difficult, so the ministry of this committee is crucial for this aspect of a vital and effective congregation.

The administrative function of the SPRC includes both leadership and management. *Leadership* is the role of "keeping an eye on the big picture." We must remember we are part of the body of Christ with a mission to make disciples of Jesus Christ.

Management is the role of tending to day-to-day activities so that details are taken care of, and strategies are implemented. Management includes holding both the staff and congregations accountable for carrying through with plans and promises.

We are continuing to review and update important documents for the employees and the church. This 3rd quarter tasks us with reviewing salary and benefit packages, reviewing, and updating, and writing new job descriptions as needed as staffing changes.

Salary and benefits are necessary things to get and keep quality staff, leaders and teachers in our building. These items do not happen without annual reviews, a balanced budget and finding ways to bring in new financial support for the building and our ministry.

We are reviewing and making changes to the Employee Handbook and Policy and Procedure Regarding Ethical Behavior pamphlet. The handbook contains many things like the benefits package along with new state and federal guidelines and laws. We hope to have this document updated soon, handed out and reviewed with all the new and existing employees.

Keeping these things in mind we are working within the Music ministry as we are changing, saying goodbye to our accompanist Daniel, to guitarist Terry, and welcoming back Travis and perhaps bringing our drummer Kevin back on board.

You will see and not see some of the new things happening. The best thing happening right now is the new day care "Lucky Ducklings" has started, this will mean new sounds, new young children of Christ, along with new leaders, teachers in our building. The new internet provider ALLO will be helping improve our streaming and an upgraded tool for the day care resources.

Once again, <u>To Do Our Tasks Well</u>, we need and encourage the support and input from all of our congregation members. Evaluations need to come for all areas of the church and not just a select few. We want to hear from all of you when things are going well and when things may not seem to be going as well as you might think they should be going.

Your dedicated work here, changes things.

How much compassion does it take to rise above your own pain and say, "I'll do what I can. How much courage does it take to step forward and declare, "I only have one bucket of water to throw On this fire; But I'm going to throw it with all my might."
